

is an outreach ministry sponsored by the Senior Adult Ministry of FUMC. "ALL" provides opportunities for community members to take part in a variety of five-week courses led by professionals and will cover a wide range of topics.

Each course is \$25 for a five-week, one hour per week class. Some have an additional fee for supplies or books. Classes will meet either Tuesday or Thursday, most at FUMC. Fall session will begin the week of August 31 and end the week of September 30.

Programs are geared towards those age 50+, but we welcome people of all ages to participate. There are no tests, homework, or quizzes. "ALL" is a continuing education program whose participants come from diverse backgrounds but share a common belief that lifelong learning is a great way to engage the intellect for the pure joy of learning and to develop new friends and lasting relationships.
